Leutnant Hans Adam

Born on 12th March 1921, he flew in the east with *II./JG51* from 1942, his unit moving to Tunisia later in the year. On 28th November 1942 he was wounded in combat with Spitfires, but managed to land his Bf109 safely back at base. In the summer of 1944 he flew with *JGr.Ost* and later with *3./EJG 1*. On 12th March 1945 he was shot down by P-51s. He baled out of his Bf109 south of Styding, Germany, but his parachute failed to deploy, and he fell to his death. He is buried in Flensburg, Germany.

Major Horst Ademeit

Born on 8th February 1912, he served with *I./JG 54*, initially as a *Feldwebel*. He fought through the Battle of Britain and was rescued from the Channel on 18th September 1940. All his air combat successes were claimed against the Red Air Force beginning on the second day of *Operation Barbarossa*. Commissioned late in 1941, by 18th February 1942 his score stood at 20 and on 25th was awarded the *Deutsches Kreuz im Gold*. On 7th March he is reported to have taken command of *6 Staffel*. The *Ritterkreuz* award followed on 16th April 1943 after 53 victories. He was promoted to lead

Adameit

I Gruppe on 18th January 1944, having been promoted to *Oberleutnant* during summer 1943. His 100th victory came on 7th October 1943. On 2nd March 1944 he received the *Eichenlaub* (No.414). Temporarily promoted to lead the *Geschwader* early in August 1944 he was lost on 7th August. His FW190 was last seen at low level chasing an Il-2 *Shturmovik* into enemy-held territory and he did not return.

Adolph

Hauptmann Walter Adolph

Born on 11th June 1913 in Rumania, he enlisted in the *Luftwaffe* pre-war and fought in Spain with *Jagdgruppe J.88* claiming one victory. Before the opening of hostilities he had received the *Spanienkreuz im Gold* and subsequently fought through the Battle of France as *Staffelkapitan* of *2./JG 1* (later renamed *8./JG 27*) during which time he scored three victories. The Battle of Britain followed seeing him transferred to *II./JG 26* on 3rd October 1940 as *Gruppenkommandeur* and claiming a further six kills before then end of the year for which the *Ritterkreuz* was awarded on 13th November. On 18th September 1941 he led his new FW190s to engage an RAF Blenheim formation off Ostend but was engaged, shot down and killed by a 41 Squadron Spitfire flown by Pilot Officer C.F.Babbage. His body was washed up at Knokke Belgium 24 days later.

Ahnert

Oberfeldwebel Heinrich-Wilhelm Ahnert

Born on 25th April 1915, 'Heinz' flew as a reconnaissance pilot during 1939 – 1940 over Poland and France. He was transferred to 3./JG 52 early in 1941, claiming five kills before his unit went to Russia. He was awarded the *Deutsches Kreuz in Gold* on 27th July 1942. On 23rd August he claimed his 57th and last victory, but was then shot down and killed by a Pe-2 rear gunner, his Bf109 falling near Koptewo. He was posthumously awarded the *Ritterkreuz* on the day he fell.

Leutnant Peter Ahrens

Born on 8th November 1919. He first served with a *Flak* battalion during 1939. He completed his flight training with *JGr.West* before moving to *I./JG 26*. His first victories came when *I./JG 26* did an exchange with *III./JG 54* and spent some months in Russia. Here he claimed his first four kills. Five more came on his return to the west, including four B-17s, but he was shot down by a Spitfire of 122 Squadron flown by Captain Thorvald Johnsen on 11th November 1943 and badly burned. This required hospitalisation for nearly a year and he returned to his unit in late 1944, now as a *Leutnant*. He claimed two more victories but, on 18th January 1945, he was injured after baling out of his FW190 due to an engine fire. He was killed when his engine failed while landing at Fürstenau on 4th March 1945.

Hauptmann Egon Albrecht

Born on 19th May 1918 in Brazil, he flew as a *Zerstörer* pilot with *6./ZG 1* (renamed *9./ZG 76*) then *6./SKG 210*, and again with *6./ZG 1*, becoming *Staffelkapitän* on 12th June 1942. He flew initially in the west, then Russia in 1942. He was awarded the *Deutsches Kreuz in Gold* on 3rd December and the *Ritterkreuz* on 22nd May 1943, having destroyed 11-15 aircraft in air combat and much enemy materiel in numerous ground strafes. He was also wounded twice, receiving

the Wound Badge. His unit was transferred to the west in late 1943 and he became *Gruppenkommandeur* on 9th October. He fought in the *Reichsverteidigung* during 1944 and was credited with at least 7 four-engined bombers before his unit was re-equipped with Bf109Gs and renamed *III./JG 76*. On 25th August he was forced to abort a sortie due to engine problems, but was intercepted by American Lightnings near St. Claude, where he was shot down and killed. He is believed to have made several earlier claims against the Red Air Force.

Oberleutnant Heinz Altendorf

Born 29th February 1917, he flew with 7./JG 53 from the beginning of the war and was credited with four kills during the French campaign and a further three during the Battle of Britain. On 5th October 1940 his aircraft was damaged in combat and he force-landed at Cap Gris Nez, uninjured. He went to Russia with his unit in 1941 as *Kapitän* of 7 *Staffel* and on 23rd June survived a forced landing. After receiving credit for a further 17 kills, he transferred with his unit to North Africa. Here, on 16th December 1941, his aircraft was shot down by British AA fire and he belly-landed at Mechili, Libya, to become a prisoner. He was awarded the *Deutsches Kreuz in Gold* on 20th February 1942 while in captivity. He was a prisoner for five years and then emigrated to Canada, where he died on 14th September 2008.

Born 16th July 1919, he flew with *LG 1* and *I./ZG 2* before moving to nightfighting. He became *Staffelkapitän* of *2./NJG 3* from 22nd October 1941 until August 1942. He then led *2./NJG 4* from 1st October 1942. On 17th August 1943 he was shot down in combat with B-17s, his Bf110 coming down 25km north of Ghent, Belgium, but he was unhurt. On 10th October 1943 he became *Staffelkapitän* of *12./NJG 5* from 10th October 1943 until 3rd January 1944 when he became *Kommandeur* of *IV./NJG 5*. During the night of 2nd January 1944 he was wounded in combat, and at 2015 hrs on 20th January 1944 he was shot down and wounded, his Bf110 coming down at Terneberg, taking his two crew members to their deaths. On 22nd October 1944 he was relieved on his command and demoted for reasons unknown. He survived the war.

nightfighter in combat, achieving his 25th and last victory – a Mosquito – on 3rd April. He survived the war, despite having to bale out of an Me262 following a high-speed stall in which his *Bordfunker* was killed. On 7th May he simply cycled home to avoid surrendering!

Born on 21st April 1920. On 1st April 1943 he joined *JFS 5* and soon moved on to *IV./JG 27* defending the Ploesti oilfields. On 9th July 1943 after claiming a B-24 his Bf109 was hit in the engine by return fire and he force-landed at Malemes, Crete. Later in the year he was transferred to *2./JGr.Süd*, with which unit he claimed a B-17 and four P-38s before returning to *IV./JG 27* in the spring of 1944. On 24th May 1944, after claiming a B-17, he was himself shot down and baled out his Bf109 with a bullet wound in his shoulder and extensive burns. He returned to *JG 27* in May 1944 as •Staffelkapitän of *10./JG 27*, a position he held until September 1944 when he became the *Staffelkapitän* of *13./JG 27*. On 2nd November 1944 he was shot down and wounded in combat with Allied aircraft, his Bf109 coming down at Mieschen. On 31st March 1945 he became the last *Staffelkapitän* of *6./JG 27*. His last claim came on 16th April 1945 and, although he claimed a Thunderbolt, his opponent was certainly a 122 Wing Tempest. It is possible that he was responsible for the loss of Wing Commander Richard 'Boy' Brooker, who was killed. Altnorthoff survived the war.

Hauptmann Hans-Heinz Augenstein

Born 11th July 1921, he joined 7./NJG 1 in late 1942 and began to score quite rapidly against RAF Bomber Command aircraft, winning the *Deutsches Kreuz in Gold* on 16th January 1944 and, on 1st March 1944, was promoted to lead 12 *Staffel*. On 9th June 1944 he received the *Ritterkreuz*, having claimed some 35 night victories. However, on 15/16th June 1944 his Bf110 was attacked and shot down near Roubaix Belgium, possibly by Flight Lieutenant Bill Provan of 29 Squadron. Just over a month later, on 28/29th July 1944 he was again wounded southeast Biblis, almost certainly by Flying Officer Roy Lelong of 605 Squadron. On the night of 6/7th December 1944 he made his last flight, being shot down and killed near Münster by Flight Lieutenant Edward Hedgecoe of the Fighter Interception Unit.
